I. INTRODUCTION

1. Pursuant to the order of the Trial Chamber VI (“Chamber”) in its Decision Setting the Commencement Date of the Trial and Related Deadlines,¹ the Prosecution hereby submits its: (1) list of witnesses; (2) proposed order of appearance; and (3) summaries of anticipated testimony.

II. CONFIDENTIALITY

2. Pursuant to regulation 23*bis*(1) of the Regulations of the Court, all three Annexes to this filing are filed as confidential because they contain information that would or may identify Prosecution witnesses. The Prosecution submits that they are of such nature that no meaningful public redacted version is feasible.

III. SUBMISSIONS

3. Confidential Annex A contains the Prosecution’s list of witnesses. This list includes columns indicating: the witness’s pseudonym number (referred to in the heading as “code”); name; type of witness (e.g., Seleka insider, crime base, etc.); whether the witness has dual witness/victim status; projected order of calling; proposed mode of testimony (e.g., full *viva voce*, 68(3), 68(2)(b) or 68(2)(c)); anticipated language of testimony, and estimated length of questioning by the Prosecution. The Prosecution has also included a column indicating whether, for a particular witness, it intends to request rule 74 counsel, in-court protective measures, or use of audio-video link technology.

4. For the convenience of the Chamber, Parties, and Participants, the Prosecution is also submitting (as Confidential Annex B) a separate, simplified document with its live witnesses arranged in order of their projected order of calling.²

5. Confidential Annex C contains summaries of the anticipated testimony of all of the Prosecution's witnesses. These summaries also contain information about each witness's known kinship or other relationship to other witnesses or other relevant persons in this case.
