PRE-TRIAL CHAMBER II of the International Criminal Court issues this Decision regarding the 'OPCD Request for Leave to Appear on Prosecution's Request to Hold a Hearing on the Confirmation of Charges against Joseph Kony in his Absence'.

1. On 8 July 2005, the Chamber (in a previous composition) issued the 'Warrant of Arrest for Joseph Kony',¹ which was amended on 27 September 2005.²

2. On 24 November 2022, the Prosecution requested the Chamber to hold a hearing on the confirmation of charges against Joseph Kony in his absence (the 'Prosecution's Request').³

3. On 2 December 2022, the Chamber found that it was not necessary to consider a request by the Office of Public Counsel for Victims for an extension of time to file a response to the Prosecution's Request, and that an order on the conduct of the proceedings related to the Prosecution's Request will be issued in due course.⁴

4. Notwithstanding the aforementioned decision, the Office of the Public Counsel for the Defence (the 'OPCD') requested leave to appear before the Chamber in relation to the Prosecution's Request on the same day (the 'OPCD Request').⁵

5. Considering that an order on the conduct of the proceedings is forthcoming, the Chamber finds that is not necessary to address the OPCD Request at present. However, the Chamber notes that the OPCD seeks leave to provide submissions in connection with the Prosecution's Request and, at the same time, includes the substance of the proposed submissions. In the view of the Chamber, this defeats the purpose of a request for leave to file submissions. The proposed submissions may only be developed if and

when leave to do so is granted by the Chamber. Accordingly, the Chamber reminds the OPCD that, going forward, a request for leave to file submissions shall not include the substance of the proposed submissions.

FOR THESE REASONS, THE CHAMBER HEREBY

FINDS that the OPCD Request need not be considered at present.
