12	One is from Lamogi and the other is from Koro. My third wife is called		
13	ABUR Bilentina.

15	4. I trained to be a teacher from Gulu Primary Teachers' College (PTC).

17	$5. \ \ I \ started \ teaching \ in \ 1985 \ from \ Leb \ Ngec \ Displaced \ School \ in \ our \ home \ area.$		
18	From 1987 – 1998 I was teaching at Alero Primary School.

20	ABDUCTION OF DOMINIC ONGWEN.

22	6. I know Dominic Ongwen. He was my pupil in Alero Primary School. I also		
23	learnt some 25 years ago that he is my nephew because his grandmother is		
24	my Aunt. I remember him so vividly because I taught local cultural dance,		
25	and Ongwen was a very active student. He enjoyed my class, and other		
26	areas of the arts.

28	7. Ongwen was abducted on his way from his home in Coorom to Alero		
29	Primary School. He was abducted together with his comrades Opiyo Olal

1	and one David, whose other name I have forgotte	en. We learnt of this when	
2	news reached school that three of our children ha	ve been abducted.

4	8. When Ongwen was abducted, he was about 10, m.	aybe 11 years old and was	
5	in primary three class. That was the average age	of that class around 1987,	
6	owing to the general insecurity that made ch	ildren begin school late.	
7	Ongwen was also staying in a very remote place s	o he needed to travel long	
8	distance in order to access school.		
9			
10	9. The father of Ongwen, the late Opobo, was my ne	phew, hence Mr. Ongwen	
11	is traditionally my nephew too. I learnt this later w	hen Ongwen was already	
12	in captivity. I learned this some twenty year	rs ago when Ongwen's	
13	grandmother, Anna, visited her maiden home, w	hich is our home.	
14			
15	10. Ongwen's other teachers were the late Opiro Lu	atany Isaac, who was the	
16	head teacher, the late Olok Labite, who was the	class teacher of Ongwen	
17	and Romano Achayus Odoch Jimmy still alive.
