Subject: Prosecution's request for extension of page limit for its 4th rule 68(3) application

Dear Trial Chamber VI,

The Prosecution respectfully requests a 7-page extension of the page limit for its fourth application under rule 68(3) from 12 pages to 19 pages. The Prosecution strives to file the application tomorrow.

The Prosecution considers that there are exceptional circumstances within the meaning of regulation 37(2) of the Regulations, justifying an extension of the page limit for the following reasons:

The 68(3) application in question pertains to 7 insiders witnesses: 6 witnesses are insiders that mainly relate to the OCRB and provide linkage evidence in relation to Mr SAID and 1 insider relates to the workings of the Ministry of Public Security and provides evidence on its overall process related to correspondence during the Seleka regime. Their evidence corroborates other witnesses who will be called to testify in person. While the Prosecution will keep the request concise and avoid repetition, it will not be able to cover all of the necessary information relating to these 7 witnesses within the current 12 page limit. However, it is in the interests of judicial economy that all 7 witnesses are included in one single application, as this will substantially reduce the overall amount of pages that the Prosecution will use to make its arguments in relation to the 7 witnesses.

The Defence and the Legal Representative of Victims do not oppose the Prosecution's request for this limited amount of additional pages.

The Prosecution therefore requests that the page limit for this application be extended by 7 pages, from 12 pages to 19 pages.
