Subject: Prosecution request for a 4-page extension for the submission of its second application under rule 68(2)(b)

Dear Trial Chamber VI,

The Prosecution respectfully requests a 4-page extension of the page limit for its second application under rule 68(2)(b) from 12 pages to 16 pages. The Prosecution seeks to file the application on Friday, 13 May 2022.

The Prosecution considers that there are exceptional circumstances within the meaning of regulation 37(2) of the Regulations, justifying an extension of the page limit for the following reasons:

The 68(2)(b) application in question pertains to 7 witnesses relevant to the chapeau elements of the charges. Of particular note, these 7 witnesses all provide evidence related to crimes committed as a part of the charged attack on the civilian population in Bangui perceived to support BOZIZE from at least April 2013 to at least November 2013. Their evidence corroborates other witnesses who will be called to testify in person. While the Prosecution will keep the request concise and avoid repetition, it will not be able to cover all of the necessary information relating to these 7 witnesses within the current 12 page limit. However, it is in the interests of judicial economy that all 7 witnesses are included in one single application, as this will substantially reduce the overall amount of pages that the Prosecution will use to make its arguments in relation to the 7 witnesses.

The Defence and the Legal Representative of Victims do not oppose the Prosecution's request for this limited amount of additional pages.

The Prosecution therefore requests that the page limit for this application be extended to 16 pages.
