LIST OF ALLEGED HARM

I. Material loss

(a) Houses and household items

For example: type of house that is common in Bogoro, built of straw, bricks, sun-dried blocks, with an outhouse, roofing sheets; kitchen utensils; furniture (table, chair and bed); and other common essential items for daily use.

(b) Essential personal belongings for daily use

For example: clothing, tools and school supplies.

(c) Other immovable and movable property

For example: outhouses, store, restaurant, bakery, hotel and hairdressing salon.

(d) Livestock

For example: livestock for subsistence, cows, chickens, cocks, hens, goats, and sheep.

(e) Farmed land

For example: plot of land mainly for daily subsistence or minor sales in the market.

(f) Family legacy (inheritance)

(g) Loss of opportunity/living standard/social status

For example: owing to the death of the person who provided a family's complete or partial means of subsistence; resulting from an increase in the number of people to provide for; resulting from the loss of opportunity to attend school or receive vocational training; owing to reduced capacity to work.

II. Bodily harm

For example: gunshot or machete wound; injury from sexual violence; assault leading to permanent or temporary physical disability.

III. Mental harm

- (a) Mental harm caused by witnessing the attack on Bogoro
- (b) Mental harm caused by the death of a close relative

For example: monetary value irrespective of or depending on kinship (parent, child, other close relative), maximum per person or per family.

- (c) Mental harm caused by physical assault
- (d) Mental harm as a result of loss of opportunity/standard of living/social status
- (e) Mental harm as a result of being forced into exile, uprooted and separated from family members
- (f) Mental harm passed down from one generation to another
