### Chronology of Relevant Events

1 June 2010	Bangladesh became a State Party to the Rome Statute.
9 October 2016	ARSA reportedly launched attacks on three BGP posts in northern Rakhine State. The <i>Tatmadaw</i> immediately declared the initiation of “clearance operations”.
12 November 2016	ARSA reportedly launched further attacks.
16 February 2017	Myanmar Government declared the end of the operations.
24 March 2017	UN HRC established the UN FFM.
25 August 2017	ARSA reportedly launched attacks on some 30 BGP posts and an army base in northern Rakhine State. The <i>Tatmadaw</i> embarked on “clearance operations”.
5 September 2017	Reported date when the operations ended, according to the Myanmar Government.
13 November 2017	<i>Tatmadaw</i> Investigation Team’s findings were released, denying wrongdoing.
10 January 2018	<i>Tatmadaw</i> Investigation Team’s additional findings were released, finding “security forces” and villagers were involved in executing ten detained men in Inn Din in September 2017.
10 April 2018	Media reported the <i>Tatmadaw</i> announcing that seven soldiers had been sentenced for their involvement in the killing of ten Rohingya men in Inn Din.
30 July 2018	Myanmar Government established the ICOE.
6 September 2018	Pre-Trial Chamber I issued the Jurisdiction Decision.
17 September 2018	UN FFM issued its detailed report, reporting that over one million Rohingya from Myanmar were living in refugee camps in Bangladesh.

- 18 September 2018 Prosecutor communicated that the Prosecution would carry out a full-fledged preliminary examination of the situation.
- 27 September 2018 UN HRC voted to establish the IIMM.
- 22 December 2018 UNGA called for the IIMM's expeditious entry into operation.
- 18 March 2019 Reported starting date of the military investigation court announced by the *Tatmadaw*.
- 29 May 2019 Media reported the *Tatmadaw* confirming the reduction of the sentence of the seven soldiers involved in the Inn Din killings and their release in November 2018.
