Specialized PT for trauma survivors can help those who have suffered physical atrocities including beatings, gunshot wounds, burns, rape, and forced labour. 2. Strengthening provider capacity through psychologist training and clinical supervision, physiotherapist training, and mentorship aimed at helping provide clinically sound services while building the capacity of a local network of providers. The project will engage a well-established network of local medical providers and mental health counsellors from across the identified affected areas. 3. Addressing sustainable action and benefits through economic empowerment and community integration for victims. The project will empower the survivors with economic skills such as but not limited to entrepreneurship skills, optimizing digital opportunities, income earning opportunities, and savings for sustainability purposes and link them up with existing opportunities to implement the skills acquired. |
