Planned activities	<p>Services will be provided in integrated and multidisciplinary approach to address the multiple forms of harm suffered by victims.</p> <p><u>Psychological and medical services:</u> provision to specific categories of victims (women and children, SGBV survivors, victims of occupation). Treatment teams consists of medical unit, psychological unit, and social unit to include physicians, social workers, psychologists, psychiatrists, child and adult psychotherapists. Medical assessment, medical examination and diagnosis, medical referrals as necessary to clinics or hospitals for specialized treatment.</p> <p><u>Empowering women leaders</u> through capacity building and awareness raising trainings ensuring their greater participation in their communities. Community based interventions will be conducted throughout the area, including family members of specific victims and their immediate social environment.</p> <p><u>Employment and livelihood opportunities</u> will be directed towards women to improve household economies.</p> <p><u>Informal education activities for youth</u>, which will contribute to their social cohesion and healing of their memories. Business sector involved in skills training for victims through grants program.</p>

Planned activities	<p><u>Mental health and psychosocial support:</u> provided by a multidisciplinary team trained in effective, evidence based interventions for traumatized individuals, families, and communities. Mental health service will offer both trauma specific and trauma informed care to victims.</p> <p><u>Medical rehabilitation:</u> coordinated by 2 general practitioners, one of which is a local medical doctor and another experienced psycho-somatologist, with experience working with severe torture, abuse, and trauma victims. GP assessment and consultations will refer clients to relevant specialists/clinics for care, treatment, and medication.</p> <p><u>Socio-economic support:</u> provide income generating activities and livelihood programming to improve household economics.</p> <p><u>Community mobilization component:</u> activities will be planned together with IDPs community representatives and involve local and displaced communities, and memorials intended to foster social support systems, reconciliation, and integration. Implement several events and campaigns with IDPs to promote peace building activities.</p> <p><u>Advocacy component:</u> vis-à-vis local and central government authorities to ensure sustainability of initiated processes and society involvement in general. Advocacy and lobbying for relevant rights-based policies, laws, programs, and initiatives.</p>
