Beneficiaries	Victims and communities who suffered harm as a result of a crime the commission of any crime since 2012, falling within the jurisdiction of the International Criminal Court.
Crimes	Crimes against humanity and/or war crimes
Objective of the planned activities	To provide assistance of a reparative value, to victims of the most serious crimes in the Gao and Mopti regions and Bamako District, through a holistic approach. Depending on the harm suffered by the victims and their family members, the assistance provided could be in the form of physical and/or psychological rehabilitation and material support.
Planned activities	<p><u>Rollout of measures for the physical rehabilitation of female and male victims</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Refer victims to health centres to receive medical and/or paramedical care for their physical injuries. • Work with the health sector to provide sustained health care that is necessary for the lasting rehabilitation of victims <p><u>Rollout measures for mental health and psychosocial support</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provide the necessary tools and skills for the management of stress and trauma developed by local stakeholders as a spin-off result of working with victims; • Individual or collective psychosocial support to help a victim and/or a group of victims manage the impact of the crimes on their mental health; • Community-based interventions and dialogue to facilitate community trauma relief and victim acceptance, and to address the past so as to build a better future (in particular, community-based consultation on the causes of conflict, training in conflict management, as well as support for intra-community and inter-community dialogue, peace-building and symbolic community-based actions); • Raise community awareness on reconciliation and social cohesion, mediation, defending victims' rights and renunciation of violence, including rape and sexual violence in public and private;

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Advocate for the situation of victims and communities affected by cycles of violence to raise awareness of the situation of victims and contribute to the recognition of their circumstances and rehabilitation needs. <p><u>Rollout measures for material support of reparative value for male and female victims</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Vocational training (such as, training for the development and management of income-generating activities, skills-based activities); • Support for the diversification of means of subsistence on livelihood; • Entrepreneurship support, including for access to funding and management and financial training; • Access to financial schemes, in particular, micro-credit; • Help building savings, facilitate access to basic services such as formal and informal education/schooling; • Help rebuilding local communities which were seriously damaged during the cycles of violence.
