- 13 PRESIDING JUDGE KORNER: [9:33:34] Yes. Good morning, all. Could we call the
- 14 case, please.
- 15 THE COURT OFFICER: [9:33:38] Good morning, Madam President. This is the
- situation in Darfur, Sudan, in the case of The Prosecutor versus Ali Muhammad Ali
- 17 Abd-Al-Rahman, case reference ICC-02/05-01/20.
- 18 And, for the record, we are in open session.
- 19 PRESIDING JUDGE KORNER: [9:33:55] Yes. Appearances from the Prosecution,
- 20 please.
- 21 MR NICHOLLS: [9:34:01] Good morning, Madam President. Good morning, your
- 22 Honours. Good morning to everyone in the courtroom and joining remotely. Julian
- Nicholls with Claire Sabatini, Laura Morris, Diana Saba, and Edward Jeremy. Thank
- 24 you.
- 25 PRESIDING JUDGE KORNER: [9:34:15] Defence.

- 1 MR LAUCCI: [9:34:17](Interpretation) Good morning, your Honour. Good morning,
- 2 your Honours. Good morning, dear colleagues. For Mr Al-Rahman, present in the
- 3 courtroom this morning, Madam Marguerite Remy, intern in the Defence team;
- 4 Madam Eva Kalb, assistant responsible for evidence analysis; Mr Ahmad Issa, our case
- 5 manager; and Audrey Mateo, legal advisor; my colleague, Iain Edwards; and myself,
- 6 Cyril Laucci, counsel.
- 7 PRESIDING JUDGE KORNER: [9:34:56] Yes. The representatives of the victims.
- 8 Announce yourself and then I'll ask.
- 9 MR SHAH: [9:35:11] Yes. Good morning, Madam President, your Honours. Good
- 10 morning to everyone in and around the courtroom. The participating victims are
- 11 represented today by the legal representative, Ms Wistinghausen who appears
- 12 remotely, myself, Anand Shah. I'm assisted by our interns Nur Mahameed and Saskia
- 13 Adjowa Afande. Thank you.
- 14 PRESIDING JUDGE KORNER: [9:35:33] Right. Thank you. Yes, I see Ms
- 15 Wistinghausen is on the screen.
- 16 Yes. All right. We have a Status Conference today which was originally intended just
- for the Defence, but in the light of some of the matters that have arisen, we're going to
- deal, first of all, with that which the parties have all been dealing with in advance, in
- 19 particular Mr Laucci's request that the protocol that's been in place, I think, since 2011
- 20 should be amended for this case.
- 21 Right. I've seen -- Mr Laucci or Mr Edwards, whichever, we've seen your application.
- 22 As I understand it, you want VWS to be involved and see any potential witnesses even
- before you've decided that they'll become witnesses; is that right?
- MR LAUCCI: [9:36:56](Interpretation) I'm sorry, your Honour, I immediately got up
- 25 when you mentioned a request of the Defence to amend the protocol. We're not

- demanding that or requesting that. The protocol is in place, I know that. It was
- 2 contested by multiple Defence teams in other cases, but we are not asking for its
- 3 amendment. Quite the contrary. We are asking for it to be precisely applied, and in
- 4 particular, the exact application of Article 1(2) thereof which requires for its application
- 5 for the Defence teams because the version of the defence of this protocol was never
- 6 negotiated since its entry into force or the entry into force of the version that the
- 7 Prosecutor, so such that this protocol envisaged to be applied by the Office of the
- 8 Prosecutor be adapted mutatis mutandis to the needs of the Defence.
- 9 What is lacking at the moment, and I'm very sorry about this if our submissions were
- interpreted differently, but we are asking for no amendment to the protocol.
- 11 PRESIDING JUDGE KORNER: [9:38:15] Hang on a moment, Mr Laucci. Article 1(2)
- says that the protocol -- sorry:
- "... will enter into further consultations on the issue of the protection of persons at risk
- on account of their interaction with the Defence and with Victims. Pending
- 15 conclusions of agreement with these other bodies, the provisions of the present
- protocol apply mutatis mutandis to the protection of persons at risk on account of their
- 17 interaction with them."
- 18 Everybody else seems to think that means that after you've identified to the VWS the
- 19 witnesses you propose to call, it's at that stage that the VWS makes an assessment of
- 20 the risk, not every time you see a witness in case they may be able to give evidence and
- in case you do want to call them. You've got to actually say, "We're proposing to call
- 22 them." Unless I've got it wrong, but that's what everybody else seems to think is the
- 23 protocol.
- MR LAUCCI: [9:39:41](Interpretation) If I may answer this question, your Honour. I'll
- 25 do say without difficulty. I'm just turning to my colleague from the Registry. Given

- that this protocol and its existence is public, would you like us to answer in public
- 2 session to your question? Because it's going to take -- go into some of the details of the
- 3 content of the protocol, and bad timing given what's going on in the gallery.
- 4 PRESIDING JUDGE KORNER: [9:40:10] I am sorry. Is there any reason why this
- 5 protocol shouldn't be mentioned in open session?
- 6 MS VUKASINOVIC: [9:40:21] Good morning, Madam President. Good morning, your
- 7 Honours. My name is Jelena Vukasinovic. I represent the Registry. We have our
- 8 colleague from VW, Gerhard van Rooyen, with us and we would prefer if we can go
- 9 into closed session.
