- 12 The International Criminal Court is now in session.
- 13 Please be seated.
- 14 PRESIDING JUDGE KORNER: [9:40:59] Yes.
- 15 Can we call the case, please.
- 16 THE COURT OFFICER: [9:41:01] Good morning, Madam President. Good morning,
- 17 your Honours.
- 18 This is the Situation in Darfur, Sudan, in the case of The Prosecutor versus Ali
- 19 Muhammad Ali Abd-Al-Rahman ("Ali Kushayb"), case reference ICC-02/05-01/20.
- 20 And for the record, we are in open session.
- 21 PRESIDING JUDGE KORNER: [9:41:25] Yes. Thank you very much.
- 22 Right. First of all, good morning everybody, and happy new year to all.
- 23 Though it could have been a happier start to the new year, if I may say so.
- 24 All right. We are at present -- well, first of all, actually, sorry, a month off has stopped
- 25 all the procedures in my mind. Can we have the appearances from the Prosecution,

- 7 morning, your Honours, and my best wishes to you, and also to my colleagues in the
- 8 Office of the Prosecutor, the Legal Representatives of Victims, the representatives of the
- 9 Registry.
- 10 And this morning, for the Defence, we have Mr Thomas Chatelet, who is an intern with
- us in our team; Madame Eva Kalb; and Mr Ahmad Issa, who is our legal assistant; Mr
- 12 Iain Edwards; and myself, with Mr Abd-Al-Rahman, who is also present in the
- 13 courtroom, myself, Mr Cyril Laucci.
- 14 PRESIDING JUDGE KORNER: [9:42:58] Yes. Thank you, Mr Laucci.
- 15 And the Representatives of the Victims?
- 16 MS VON WISTINGHAUSEN: [9:43:05] Good morning, Madam President, your
- 17 Honours, dear colleagues. Happy and healthy new year to everyone.
- 18 The victims today are represented by associate counsel, Anand Shah; our case manager,
- 19 Saif Kassis. We have an intern, Beatrice Carpani, and a visiting professional, Charlotte
- 20 Imhof, and myself, Natalie von Wistinghausen.
- 21 PRESIDING JUDGE KORNER: [9:43:25] Yes. Thank you very much, Ms von
- 22 Wistinghausen.
- 23 And finally the Registry, please.
- 24 MR DUBUISSON: [9:43:31](Interpretation) Madam President, your Honours. First of
- all, best wishes to you for 2024.

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- 1 And for the Registry, we have today Anne-Aurore Bertrand, who is cooperation
- 2 adviser; Vera Wang, who is coordinator for external affairs; Natalie Wagner, who is
- 3 legal coordinator; and Gerhard van Rooyen, who is the administrator; and myself, Mr
- 4 Marc Dubuisson, who is representing Mr Osvaldo Giler, the Registrar. Thank you.
