Short Bio. | Mr Vladimir Tochilovsky



Mr Tochilovsky has considerable experience in criminal justice both in national and international jurisdictions. He was a trial attorney and investigation team leader in the United Nations International Criminal Tribunal for the former Yugoslavia (“ICTY”) (1994–2010). In addition, he chaired reviews of indictments in the ICTY Office of the Prosecutor (“OTP”) (2000–2001) and coordinated the development of regulations related to investigation and prosecution for the OTP (1999–2003). Before joining ICTY, he was the Deputy Procurator for judicial matters of Odesa region (1987–1994) and a District Attorney in Odesa region (1976–1987).

He participated in the early stages of the development of the International Criminal Court (“ICC”), both as an official representative of the ICTY to the *Preparatory Committee for the Establishment of the ICC and the Preparatory Commission for the ICC* (1997–2001) and as a member of two expert groups that prepared recommendations for the ICC-OTP (2002–2003). Mr Tochilovsky was the Eastern European member of the United Nations Working Group on Arbitrary Detention (2010 – 2016). He is a member of the independent Advisory Panel of the Commission for International Justice and Accountability (2013–present). Mr Tochilovsky is a Ph.D holder. He taught at Mechnikov National University, Ukraine (1991–1994). He has authored numerous publications, including books, on international criminal justice and human rights in criminal justice.
