## **I. Introduction**

1. On 24 January 2012, Pre-Trial Chamber I (“Chamber”) ordered the Registry’s Victims Participation and Reparations Section (“VPRS”) to report every three months on the applications received in the Situation in Libya.<sup>1</sup>

## **II. Applicable Law**

2. The Registry submits the present report in accordance with articles 68(1) and (3) of the Rome Statute, rules 16(1) and 89(1) of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence and regulation 86 of the Regulations of the Court.

## **III. Submission**

3. The Registry notes that no new applications have been received since the Registry’s seventeenth periodic report on applications received in the Situation in Libya (“Seventeenth Periodic Report”).<sup>2</sup> Therefore, the information presented in the Seventeenth Periodic Report and referred to in subsequent reports remains unchanged.
4. The Registry also notes that the warrant of arrest for Al-Tuhamy Mohamed Khaled, issued under seal *ex parte* on 18 April 2013, was unsealed on 24 April 2017.<sup>3</sup> The Registry remains very attentive to any developments in the region which may lead to an arrest of any of the fugitives, which, in turn, would trigger relevant victims’ participation activities.
