- 1. The Prosecution does not, in principle, object to the Defence's request for an extension of time to file its appeal brief on the remaining grounds of appeal to one week following the Registry's provision of the Kinyarwanda translation of the judgment ("Request"), provided the Prosecution remains entitled to 60 days thereafter to file its response in accordance with Regulation 59(1) of the Regulations of the Court.<sup>2</sup>
- 2. That said, given the Registry's advice that the draft Kinyarwanda translation will be completed by 17 February 2020,<sup>3</sup> a revised briefing schedule accommodating the Request will result in the Chamber being briefed on the Defence's appeal against the Conviction Decision by late April 2020 (subject to any Defence request to reply) after it has been briefed on the Defence's appeal against the Sentencing Decision.<sup>4</sup> The Prosecution considers that it would be preferable to address the Defence appeal against the Conviction Decision prior to its appeal against the Sentencing Decision. In this context, and noting that the Defence has already had over six months to-date to draft its conviction appeal brief after several extensions of time,<sup>5</sup> if the Defence is in a position to file its appeal brief before receipt of the Kinyarwanda translation, and without prejudice to any request the Defence may seek to make to amend the appeal brief once the translation is received, the Prosecution would not object to an earlier deadline for the filing of the Defence appeal brief and corresponding filing of the Prosecution response within 60 days.
