#### I. INTRODUCTION

 The Prosecution hereby notifies Trial Chamber I ("Chamber") of the disclosure of evidence pursuant to articles 64(3)(c) and 67(1)(a) and (b) of the Rome Statute, and rule 77 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence.

## II. CLASSIFICATION

2. This filing is classified as public with one confidential annex, comprising the list of evidence disclosed to the Defence. This annex is classified as confidential since it contains confidential information.

## III. SUBMISSIONS

- 3. On 1 and 3 December 2021, the Prosecution disclosed to the Defence three packages consisting of 190 items (9.421 pages):
  - Pre-Trial Rule 77 package 47, consisting of 25 items (3.601 pages);
  - Pre-Trial Rule 77 package 48, consisting of 105 items (4.970 pages); and
  - Pre-Trial INCRIM package 83, consisting of 60 items (850 pages).
- 4. Pre-Trial Rule 77 packages 47 and 48 contain items responsive to keywords provided by the Defence and material to their preparation.
- 5. Pre-Trial INCRIM package 83 contains items related to witnesses P-0874, P-0885 and P-1021 whose identities cannot be disclosed at this stage. For this reason, the Prosecution applied redactions under code F to information that might reveal the witnesses' identity and filed an application seeking the

delayed disclosure of the witnesses' identifying information,<sup>1</sup> as instructed by the Pre-Trial Chamber II.<sup>2</sup>

6. With concern to redactions, and in addition to the F redactions applied in Pre-Trial INCRIM package 83, the Prosecution applied standard redactions pursuant to the procedure for exceptions to disclosure that was stipulated by the Single Judge of the Pre-Trial Chamber II.<sup>3</sup>
